Did You Know?????

In the early centuries of the Catholic Church, the cross was seen as a symbol of defeat. In the Roman world, death by crucifixion was reserved for the common criminal; the cross reminded Christians of the death of Jesus and man's inhumanity to man.

As a result, early Christians used other images and symbols to represent their faith. The anchor represented the faith that could provide stability in the stormy waters of life. The fish was an acronym in Greek for Jesus Christ, savior of humanity and the lighthouse described Jesus as the Light of the World.

Emperor Constantine claimed to have a vision of the cross on the eve of his victorious battle to win control over Rome. From that point, Christians interpreted the cross as a victory over death.

Today, the Cross is the primary symbol of those who believe in Jesus, the Son of God.

LIVES OF THE SAINTS

Occasionally in this space will appear a short article covering the lives of the saints, especially with reference to those saints whose likeness appear on the stained glass windows in the church and chapel, or whose statue is present in the chapel area or the candle room area.

ST. ANTONY GIANELLI

Bishop of Bobbio

Antony Mary Gianelli came from a hard working family in Genoa. He spent his days studying at school rather than helping his father and brothers on the farm. Antony wanted to attend the seminary when he finished school but his family could not afford it. The owner of the farm decided to pay Antony's way.

Antony received special dispensation because he was not old enough and soon he became a priest. He was also known for his eloquent preaching and his pastoral work. Antony founded two Orders, but both eventually dissolved.

After more than two decades of dedicated service, Antony was named Bishop of Bobbio. He was a wise and caring leader who did all he could do to reach out to his parishioners. Antony organized the societies of St. Raphael and St. Dorothea to help the faithful learn their catechism. He also managed to make visits to all of his parishes three times within eight short years.

Antony was canonized in 1951 by Pope Pius II.

ST. BONIFACE

Patron of Germany, Tailors and Others

He was baptized Winfrid and when he became a priest took the name of Boniface. After three years Pope Gregory II made him a bishop and sent him to Germany. He built new monasteries and imported well trained monks and nuns from England to minister to the people.

It has been said about this saint, "Boniface had a deeper influence on the history of Europe than any Englishman." His courage, preaching, and teaching skills inspired many for hundreds of years.

ST. NORBERT

Patron of Bohemia

Founder of the Norbertines

Norbert was born to a royal French family. Although he had no interest in religious life, he was given a minor position in his local church. His attitude changed when he was thrown from his horse and was lying near death.

He then asked the Lord, "What wilt Thou have me do?" A voice replied, "Turn away from evil and do good. Seek peace and pursue it." From then on, he devoted himself to prayer and studied diligently for the priesthood. Norbert gave away his fortune and became a traveling preacher.

When Norbert's attempts to institute reforms with the house failed, he received permission to start his own community at Premontre'. Thirteen disciples moved with him, marking the establishment of the Norbertines.

Norbert instituted a stricter code for the clergy of his diocese and gained acceptance for his reforms. Today, the Norbertines strive to be of "one heart and mind in Christ."

ST. CHARLES LWANGA & COMPANIONS

King Mtesa of Uganda had allowed the White Feathers to preach the faith in his country, but when his successor, King Mwanga assumed power he initiated a fierce persecution against all Catholics.

Among the victims of this persecution were the Ugandan youth, Charles Lwanga the chief of the royal pages and twenty-one of his companions. Since Charles was the first to be burned alive, twelve others followed him on the same day. These martyrs of Christ, the young African Christians were beatified in 1920 and canonized in 1964 by Pope Paul VI.

Our Faith

THE KEY TO UNITY IN THE CHURCH

Jesus said, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter answered and said, 'Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God.' Then Jesus answered and said, 'Blessed art thou, Simon Bar-Jona, for flesh and blood has not revealed this to thee, but my Father in heaven.

I will give thee the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever thou shalt bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever thou shalt lose on earth shall be lost in heaven."

What did Jesus do to make sure His church would always be united?

Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to dwell in His Body, which is the Church, uniting the members with one another and with Himself.

"He has shared with us His Spirit who, existing as one and the same being in the head and in the members, vivifies, unifies, and moves the whole Body.:

(Vatican Council II)

Preserve the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace; one body and one Spirit, even as you were called in one hope of your calling. One Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Gather of all."

(Ephesians 4: 3-6)

Who is the Chief Instrument of the Holy Spirit's teaching and unifying work in the Church?

The Pope, who is the Bishop of Rome and the Vicar of Christ on earth. He is the visible head of the whole Catholic Church.

"I will set up one shepherd over them, and He shall feed them." (Ezechiel 34:23)

Who was the First Pope?

Saint Peter who was made Pope by Jesus Christ Himself.

Does Jesus require us to follow the Pope in matters of faith and morals?

YES, because obedience and loyalty to the Pope are among the chief requirements of Our Lord's plan for unity in the Church.

"Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in Heaven." (Matthew 16"19)

"That all may be one, even as thou, Father, in me and I in thee that they also may be one in us."

(John 17:21)

The Holy Spirit dwells in the members of the Church and assists them by His grace in proportion to their various tasks and offices. This is how He guides the Church and gives it life and unity.

"As Christ is the Head of the Church, so is the Holy Spirit, the soul of the Church."

Can the Pope make an error when teaching doctrine or morals?

No.... when he is speaking solemnly as head of the Church. Then he has that special protection from error which God gives as spiritual safeguard for all the members of the Church.
