### THE PRIMACY OF PETER

Jesus and the disciples traveled north to the district of Caesarea Philippi. On the way, after a pause for prayer, He asked His followers:

*"Who do men say that I am?"*

"Some say John the Baptist," they answered. "Others, Elias and others Jeremias or one of the prophets. Jesus again asked:

*"But who do you say that I am."*

Now Peter replied saying, "Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God." Pleased with this declaration of faith, Jesus said:

*"Blessed art thou, Simon Bar-Jona, for flesh and blood has not revealed this to thee, but My Father in heaven. I say to thee, thou art Peter and upon this rock I will build my Church and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. I will give thee the keys of the kingdom of heaven; and whatever thou shalt bind on earth shall be bound in heaven"*

Then Jesus bade them tell no one what they had heard. At this time He predicted His passion and resurrection:

*"The Son of Man must suffer many things, and be rejected by the elders the chief priests and Scribes. He shall be put to death and on the third day rise again."*

Peter drew Him aside and began protesting that this was impossible, but Jesus rebuked him before the others:

*"Get behind me, Satan, thou art a scandal to Me. Thou dost not mind the things of God, but those of men."*

Jesus said to the disciples:

*"If anyone wishes to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross and follow Me. For he who would save his life will lose it; but he who loses his life for My sake and for the Gospel's sake will save it.*

*For what does it profit a man, if he gain the whole world, but suffer the loss of his own soul? Or what will a man give in exchange for his soul?*

*For whoever is ashamed of me and of My words in this adulterous and sinful generation of him will the Son of man also be ashamed when He comes with the holy angels in the glory of His Father.*

*"Amen I say to thee, there are some of those standing here who will not taste death, until they have seen the kingdom of God coming in power."*

## LIVES OF THE SAINTS

Occasionally in this space will appear a short article covering the lives of the saints, especially with reference to those saints whose likeness appear on the stained glass windows in

### SAINT ANTHONY OF PADUA

*Patron of the Poor, Finder of Lost Things*

Anthony was born in Portugal and baptized as Ferdinand. At the age of fifteen he entered the order of St. Augustine, but soon left for a quieter monastery in Coimbra. There he saw the bones of Franciscan martyrs from Morocco and was inspired to be like them.

He joined the Order of Friars Minor to travel to Morocco, and adopted the name of Anthony ready to start a new life. Once in Morocco, Anthony became ill and had to go back to Portugal. However, his ship was blown off course and landed in Padua, Italy instead.

Anthony lived a quiet life, until he was asked to stand in as a speaker. As he spoke to the group, they were so impressed by this short, stout man message and faith that Anthony's gift for preaching was revealed and his life changed forever. He was such a magnetic speaker that huge crowds of people sometimes 30,000 strong came to hear him. Anthony often held Mass outdoors, because no church was big enough to hold the crowds.

So many people were touched by Anthony's peacemaking efforts that he is known as the "wonder worker." His speeches were so powerful that they inspired enemies to reconcile, thieves to confess and heretics to convert. He was a defender of the poor wherever he went. The fast pace of Anthony's work led to poor health and this saintly man died at the age of thirty-six. In the Christian world St. Anthony of Padua is recognized as one of the Church's most revered saint.

In some ways, Anthony's experience as a missionary was similar to one people often face today. Haven't we all had times in our lives where, on some level, we felt like we were being "blown off course?"

### ST. EPHREM (Ephream)

*Doctor of the Church & Patron of Spiritual Leaders*

Ephrem was born to a Christian family and describe himself as a quarrelsome boy, but a brief stay in prison on a false charge helped change his life. At the age of eighteen he was baptized and studied under Bishop James of Nisibia was impressed by the boy's intelligence and writing skills.

Ephrem taught for many years at the Bishop's school until dangerous circumstances occurred which interrupted his work. The King of Persia wanted control over the city of Nisibia. His troops attacked it several times, changing the course of a nearby river to cause a flood. Ephrem prayed to fortify the citizens against the sieges, but Persia won.

Fearing persecution, Ephrems and his fellow Christians fled the city. He settled on a rocky hill where he lived as a hermit. However, he continued to write and travel into the city to preach. When several heresies against the Church emerged in the city, one heretic even wrote songs that criticized Christianity.

Ephrem saw how effective music and poetry could be in teaching and wrote hymns to spread the Christian faith instead. His hymns were so popular that he became known as "the harp of the Holy Ghost."

When famine hit the town, Ephrem tended to the sick and persuaded the wealthy to distribute food. But the long hours took their toll. He died a year later, leaving behind an extensive collection of sermons, hymns and other writings.

Music has been an important part of worship since antiquity. Today, it plays a large role in everyday life as well. Music appeals to so many that it remains an effective way to heighten society's awareness of certain issues.

## Our Faith

### OUR LADY OF FATIMA

This was the title given to the Blessed Mother because of her appearance to three shepherd children near Fatima in Portugal in the year 1917.

On the 13th day of six consecutive months (May to December) she appeared to three small children.

Lucia (Lucy) dos Santos age ten  
Francis Martos (Cousin) age nine  
Jacinta (Cousin) age seven

The three children came from a little hamlet in the parish of Fatima, about seventy miles north of Lisbon. At the time of the first apparition the children had taken their sheep there for pasture.

In these apparitions the Blessed Mother asked for prayers, particularly the daily recitation of the Rosary, penance and acts of sacrifice for the conversion of sinners. On the last apparition, October 13, 1917 she revealed herself as Our Lady of the Rosary. On that occasion 70,000 people who had gathered witnessed the Miracle of the Sun.

*(It was the unnatural rotation of the sun in the heavens for about ten minutes).*

Francis died on April 4, 1919 and Jacinta died on February 21, 1920. Lucy, the only survivor of the three visionaries became a lay sister in the Congregation of the Sisters of Saint Dorothy in Spain. In 1928 she made profession in the same Order with the name of Sister Mary Lucy of the Sorrows, and on October 3, 1934 she made her perpetual vows. In 1948 she entered the Carmelite Order in Portugal where she was professed as Sister Mary of the Immaculate Heart.

The principal element in the original apparitions at Fatima, as the three children describe them to the ecclesiastical authorities shortly after they occurred was the appeal from Our Lady of the Rosary for prayer, penance and sacrifice.

In 1927 Lucy was asked by her spiritual experiences, particularly some special revelations she had received about the devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. In these and the later writings of Lucy, enriched probably by her new revelations.

In 1922 the Bishop of Leiria began an official investigation of the events of Fatima, allowing the popular devotion to continue in the meantime. In 1930 after years of gathering and weighing the evidence for the events, he published his Pastoral Letter on Devotion to Our Lady of Fatima. The letter declared the apparitions in the Cova da Iria from May to October of 1917 to be worthy of belief and authorized devotion to Our Lady of Fatima.
