A feast was given on the anniversary of Herod's birth, in which Herodias daughter danced for Herod. He swore that he would grant whatever she asked. An officer was dispatched to prison and the daughter after consulting with her mother, John was beheaded to satisfy Herodias, a voluptuous woman.

## LIVES OF THE SAINTS

Occasionally in this space will appear a short article covering the lives of the saints, especially with reference to those saints whose likeness appear on the stained glass windows in the church and chapel, or whose statue is present in the chapel area or the candle room area.

### ST. JOSEPH CALASANZ

*Patron of Christian Schools  
Founder of the Piarist Order*

Joseph studied canon law and theology at several universities in Spain. His father wanted him to marry and carry on the family name, but Joseph chose to join the priesthood instead. He was ordained and held several important administrative posts before quitting his promising career in the Church and traveling to Rome.

Joseph was appalled by the ignorance of the poor in Rome, especially the orphaned and homeless children. Believing that education could change their lives, he tried unsuccessfully to enlist the support of various religious orders, including the Jesuits and Dominicans.

Along with three other priests, Joseph opened the first free school for poor children. With financial assistance from the Pope, the school was able to grow and soon its pupils numbered in the hundreds.

Joseph continued to supervise his teaching priests, eventually organizing them into a community called the Piarist Order. Besides the usual vows of poverty, chastity and obedience, the Piarists took a fourth vow, dedicating their lives to educating the young.

As superior of his Order, Joseph faced several obstacles. Many were opposed to educating the poor for fear it would cause social unrest. Also, his Order was nearly destroyed by internal dissension. Joseph humbly accepted his difficulties saying, "The Lord gave and the Lord hath taken away. Blessed be the name of the Lord."

St. Joseph Calasanz died at the age of ninety, but his order continues, and today he is honored as the patron of all Christian schools.

### ST. LOUIS OF FRANCE, King

*Patron of Crusaders, Soldiers and Tertiaries*

Louis was only twelve years old when his father died and Louis was crowned King of France. His mother was regent while Louis was a minor, and she provided him with a proper education and a deep reverence for religion.

At the age of twenty, Louis was happily married to Margaret of Provence, and the couple eventually had eleven children. His faith inspired in him a deep appreciation for peace.

As a ruler, he worked to unite France by eliminating the feuding and petty wars that had long divided the country. He also protected vassals from cruel lords and reformed the courts so that every man in France could receive justice. His reputation for honesty was so great that Louis was often asked to arbitrate foreign disputes.

When Christianity became threatened, Louis was quick to act. The Muslims invaded Jerusalem and Louis led a Crusade to reclaim the Holy Land. After he captured Damietta in Egypt, Louis walked barefoot with his family and nobles into the city singing a hymn to God. Unfortunately he lost the next battle and was taken prisoner. Louis had to give up Damietta and pay a ransom for his freedom.

Louis led an unusually austere life for a king. He often spent long hours in prayer and penance and encouraged morality in his court. This kind king founded several hospitals and fed over a hundred poor people every day, some at his own table.

During Louis' reign many cathedrals, monasteries and universities were built including the famous Sorbonne. To this day, King Louis of France is remembered as a great king and loyal crusader for God.
