DINNER WITH A PHARISEE

When Jesus had finished speaking, one of the Pharisees invited Him to his house for dinner. Jesus accepted the invitation, entered the man's house and reclined at the dinner table. His host dismayed, began asking himself why He had not first washed His hands, as the law of the Pharisees required. Jesus replied:

"Now you Pharisees clean the outside of the cup and the dish, but within you are full of robbery and wickedness.

Foolish ones, did not he who made the outside make the inside too? Nevertheless, give that which remains as alms, and behold, all things are clean to you.

But woe to you Pharisees, because you pay tithes on mint and rue and every herb, and disregard justice and the love of God. But these things you ought to have done, while not leaving the others undone.

Woe to you Pharisees, because you love the front seats in the synagogues and greetings in the market place. Woe to you. Because you are like hidden tombs, over which men walk unaware.'

Here a guest who was a teacher of the Law interrupted and said, "Master, in saying these things, Thou insulted us also." Jesus then said:

"Woe to you lawyers also! You load men with oppressive burdens and you yourselves with one of your fingers do not touch the burdens. Woe to you! You build the tombs of the prophets, whereas your fathers killed them, for they indeed killed them, and you build their tombs.

For this reason also the wisdom of God has said, 'I will send them prophets and apostles and some of them will be put to death and persecuted. The blood of all the prophets has been shed from the foundation of the world may be required of this generation.

From the blood of Abel unto the blood of Zacharias, who was slain between the altar and this temple.' Yes, I say to you, it shall be required of this generation.

LIVES OF THE SAINTS

Occasionally in this space will appear a short article covering the lives of the saints, especially with reference to those saints whose likeness appear on the stained glass windows in the church and chapel, or whose statue is present in the chapel area or the candle room area.

SAINT ISAAC JOGUES & COMPANIONS

Isaac Jogues, John de Brebeuf, Charles Garnier, Anthony Daniel, Gabriel Lallemant, Noel Chabanel, John de Lalande and Rene Goupil, French Jesuits, were among the missionaries who preached the Gospel to Huron and Iroquois Indians in the United States and Canada.

These men were all martyred by the Iroquois Indians in the years 1642, 1648 and 1649. Pope Pius XI beatified them on June 21, 1825 and in 1930 they were canonized by the same Pope.

St. Isaac Jogues, in particular was outstanding. In the course of his labors preaching the Gospel to the Mohawks in Canada he penetrated to the eastern entrance of Lake Superior, one thousand miles inland and became the first European to do so.

In the year 1642, he was taken captive by the Iroquois Indians and imprisoned for thirteen months. During that time, he underwent cruel tortures and ultimately lost the use of his hands. After being rescued by the Dutch, he returned to Canada two years later and in 1646 he visited Auriesville, New York to negotiate peace with the Iroquois. He is said to be the first Catholic priest to have set foot on Manhattan Island.

On the third visit to the Iroquois, the clan which believed that Isaac was a sorcerer, blamed him for an outbreak of sickness and the failure of their crops. Accordingly, he was seized, tortured and beheaded.

SAINT JOHN OF CAPISTRANO

Patron Saint of Jurists

John was born at Capistrano, Italy and was the son of a former German knight of that city. He studied law at the University of Perugia and practiced in the courts of Naples. King Ladislas of Naples appointed John as governor of Perugia.

During a war with a neighboring town he was betrayed and imprisoned. Upon his release he entered the Franciscan community at Perugia. After his ordination he traveled throughout Italy, Germany, Austria, Hungary, Poland and Russia preaching penance and establishing numerous communities of Franciscan renewal.

When Mohammed II was threatening Vienna and Rome, St. John at the age of seventy was commissioned by Pope Callistus II to preach and lead a crusade against the invading Turks. Marching at the head of 70,000 Christians, he gained victory in the great battle against the Turks. Three month later he died in Hungary.

SAINT ANTHONY MARY CLARET

Bishop

Anthony was ordained a priest and after five years, he began to give missions and retreats all over Catalonia, Spain. He founded the Congregation of the Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary to continue this work on a wider scale.

In the same year, he was consecrated Bishop of Santiago de Cuba. Finding the diocese in deplorable spiritual condition, he quickly initiated vigorous reform measures, one of which was the establishment of the Teaching Sisters of Mary Immaculate.

Anthony was recalled to Spain and made the chaplain of Queen Isabella II. This position made it possible for him to continue his mission work. He established a museum, library schools and a laboratory.

Our Faith

THE SACRAMENT OF PENANCE

Did Jesus forgive sins while on earth?

Yes... He forgave the sins of the paralyzed man (Luke 5:18-26); the woman taken in adultery (John 8:1-11), the sinful woman (Luke 7:39-50) and the good thief (Luke 23: 39-43).

Did Jesus give the power to forgive sin to anyone?

Yes... to His Apostles on Easter Sunday night.

"Whose sins you shall forgive, they are forgiven them, whose sins you shall retain, they are retained."

(John 20-23)

Did Jesus want His Apostles to give this power to others?

Yes... because He died to save all people from their sins.

"This is good and agreeable in the sight of God our Savior, who wishes all men to be saved."
(1st Timothy 2: 3-4)

How did the Apostles hand down this power to others?

By making other men bishops and priests.

What is the Sacrament of Penance?

Penance is the Sacrament by which the sins committed after Baptism are forgiven. Through it sinners are renewed in grace and reconciled with God and the Church.

What do you have to do to have your serious sins forgiven?

You have to be truly sorry for them and confess them to a Catholic priest.

"He who conceals his sins prospers not, but he who confesses and forsakes them obtains mercy."
(Proverbs 28:13)

What is meant by being sorry for your sins?

It means that....

1. You sincerely regret having committed the sins and you detest those sins.
2. You sincerely intend not to commit those sins or any other sins in the future.
3. You sincerely resolve to stay away from any person, place or thing that can easily lead you into sin.

What kind of sorrow do you have to be forgiven?

1. Either the sincere but less perfect kind, when you are sorry for having offended God mainly because you fear the loss of heaven and the pains of hell.
2. When you are sorry for having offended God mainly because you love Him and realize that He is all good and worthy of all your love.

May a priest ever tell what he has heard in the Confessional?

NO...the priest is never allowed to tell what he has heard in Confession. He must be willing to suffer death rather than break that secret. This is called the "Seal of Confession."

How often are you obliged to receive the Sacrament of Penance?

At least once a year.

If you unfortunately commit a mortal sin, say the Act of Contrition right away and go to receive the Sacrament of Penance as soon as possible.
