## The Life of Jesus

Luke 13: 10- 17; 22-33

### JESUS CURES A CRIPPLED WOMAN

In a synagogue on one Sabbath Jesus saw a woman whom an evil spirit had kept hunched over for eighteen years. Calling her to Him, He said:

*"Woman, thou art delivered from thy infirmity."*

He laid His hands on her and the woman, instantly cured, began to praise God. The ruler of the synagogue then complained that Jesus broke the Sabbath. Jesus then replied:

*"Hypocrites! Does not each one of you on the Sabbath lose his animal from the manger, and lead it forth to water? This woman, whom Satan has bound for eighteen years, ought not she to be free from this bond on the Sabbath?"*

Now Jesus made for Jerusalem. In one village He was asked whether only a few men would be saved. Jesus answered:

*"Strive to enter by the narrow gate; for many I tell thee, will seek to enter and will not be able. But when the Master of the house has entered and shut the door, you will begin to stand outside and knock at the door, saying: 'I do not know where you are from.' Then you shall begin to say, 'We ate and drank in Thy presence, and Thou didst teach in our streets.'*

*And He shall say to thee, 'I do not know where you are from. Depart from Me, all you workers of iniquity.' There will be the weeping and the gnashing of teeth when you see all the prophets in the Kingdom of God.*

*But you yourselves cast forth outside. They will come from the east and from the west, from the north and south and will feast in the kingdom of God. Behold, there are those last who will be first, and there are those first who will be last."*

The same day some Pharisees told Him to leave because Herod desired to kill Him. Jesus said:

*Go and say to that fox, 'Behold, I cast out devils and perform cures today and tomorrow and the third day I am to end My course. Nevertheless, I must go on My way today and tomorrow and the next day, for it cannot be that a prophet perish outside Jerusalem.*

### ST. PHILIP NERI

*Patron of Rome*

At the age of seventeen, Philip left home to work with a merchant uncle and then settled in Rome. The following year, he found a job as a tutor and lived simply in an attic room. He spent his free time in prayer and studying theology.

This devout man often found spiritual comfort in the catacombs of Rome. He spent most of his time, preaching in the streets and visiting and caring for the sick and elderly. He soon became a priest.

Philip was well liked for his loving heart and quick wit. He led prayers in the oratory of the Church of Saint Girolamo for a group of priests not associated with any religious order. Soon lay people joined the meetings as well. Philip asked them to work at hospitals and collect charity for the poor.

Philip's leadership at the oratory stirred controversy and he was accused of being overly ambitious. He weathered these attacks and his group was later recognized as a new Order, The Congregation of the Oratory.

By the end of his life, Philip was known as "the Apostle of Rome" for his lifelong efforts to reenergize the Holy See.

### ST. BEDE THE VENERABLE

*Father of English History, Patron of Lectors and Apostle of Germany*

Bede did not know Latin, but this did not stop him from entering the monastery to study the Church and its teachings. He soon mastered the Church's official language and was ordained a priest. His greatest joy came from studying Scriptures and sharing his knowledge with others through writing and teaching.

He spent most of his time at Jarrow, England except for some brief trips he made outside the monastery's walls to preach. The learned monk also wrote about grammar and composed poetry. Bede also helped make A.D. an accepted method for dating historical events.

Despite his learned skills in Latin, Bede saw the need for using English to help spread Christianity in his homeland. Bede fell ill while working on a translation of the Gospel of John. He refused to quit the project and he finished the book before he died.

Bede was given the title of "venerable" a term of respect for distinguished members of religious orders. For hundreds of years, Church scholars have consulted Bede's commentaries on the Scriptures. His careful research methods and insightful works are highly valued to this day.

Bede's writings include works on natural phenomena, chronology, and grammar, and also commentaries on the Latin Fathers and a History of the Abbots.

Yet above all, Bede was the Christian thinker and student. Though in 1899 Bede was named Saint and Doctor of the Church, "Venerable" remains his special designation to this day.

## Our Faith

### A TIME TO THINK

In his lengthy poem about St. Joan of Arc, the French writer Charles Peguy intentionally left the first several pages blank. He did this, he explained, in order to give the reader time to think.

Hostile men confronted Him about what to do with a woman who has been caught in adultery. Jesus does not respond to them right away. Instead He quietly sits on the ground, head bowed down, tracing His fingers in the dirt. It is only after the angry mob continues to press Him for an answer that Jesus finally speaks:

*“Let the man among you who has no sin be the first to cast a stone.”*

Upon hearing these words, the accusers drop the stones they intended to throw and slinked away. But why does Jesus take so long to speak? Why the hesitation? Is Jesus stalling for time so He can find something appropriate to say? Is He trying to figure out what to do in the midst of a tense, life and death situation?

It could be that Jesus is trying to teach them, and us, that we need to take the time to think before we impulsively cast a stone at another. We need to allow time for our emotions to cool so that our fear, anger, or prejudices don't get the best of us.

We need time to consider all the variables and circumstances involved and to recall our own mistakes, shortcomings and sins. Most of all, we need time to recall the abundant mercy God has shown us and asks that we show toward others.

*Merciful God,*

*Heal my family, neighborhood, city and nation of the wounds caused by bigotry and hatred. Help me be a sign of a different way to deal with conflict and division.*

*Let me be a sign of Your Mercy, Amen*
