LITURGICAL SYMBOLS

Alb

Basic vestment of all Christian ministries recalling the "Clothing with Christ."

Candle

The candles symbolize the presence of Christ "the Light of the World."

Chalice

The principal container of the eucharistic wine, from which we receive the Blood of Christ. The chalice also signifies our longing to be filled with the Spirit of God.

Cross

The central symbol of Christian Faith.

Olive Branch

Symbol of ordained ministry in the Church. A narrow strip of cloth worn by priests and bishops draped around the neck and hangs in the front. Deacons wear the stole diagonally over the left shoulder, across the back and chest, to the right side at the waist of hip level.

Throne

Signifies God as Sovereign of the universe. Of all the saints enthroned with Christ in heaven, of the Chair of Peter and for the Popes.

Triumph of the Cross

Those who believe in Jesus crucified and risen, carry the Cross in triumph as an indisputable proof that God is love.

With the total gift of Himself on the Cross our Savior decisively conquered sin and death."

DO YOU QUESTION GOD????

Matthew 12: 1-14; Mark 2: 23-3: 6; Luke 6:- 1-21

OUR LORD OF THE SABBATH

One Sabbath Jesus was passing through a wheat field and His hungry disciples began plucking a few grains from the stands of wheat, nibbling as they walked. At once some Pharisees ran up to ask Jesus why they were breaking the Pharisaic law against harvesting on the Sabbath. Jesus replied:

“Have you not read what David did when he and those with him were hungry? How he entered the house of God and ate the leaves of proposition which neither he nor those with him could lawfully eat, but only the priests?

Or have you not read in the Law, that on the Sabbath days the priests in their temple that one greater than the temple is here. But if you knew what this means, ‘I desire mercy, and not sacrifice.’ you would never have condemned the innocent.

The Sabbath was made for man, and not man for the Sabbath. Therefore the Son of Man is Lord even of the Sabbath.”

On another Sabbath, when Jesus came to the synagogue there was a man present who had a withered hand. The sectarians had noted this circumstance and were watching Jesus to see if He would heal on the Sabbath. Jesus knew their thoughts and said to the man:

“Stand forth into the midst.”

Then turning to the Pharisees, Jesus said:

It is lawful on the Sabbath to do good, or to do evil, to save a life or to destroy it?”

The Pharisees did not answer. Jesus asked:

“What man is there among you who, if he has a single sheep and it falls into a pit on the Sabbath, will not take hold of it and lift it out? How much better is a man than a sheep? Therefore it is lawful to do good on the Sabbath.”

Jesus looked at them thoughtfully for a moment in anger and in sorrow. Then He said to the afflicted man:

“Stretch forth thy hand.”

The hand was immediately healed, but the Pharisees went out and plotted with the Herodians to kill Christ.

Summary

The Pharisees watched Our Lord and His disciples to try to catch them in some violation of the Law. Their purpose was to discredit Christ. This was hypocrisy. They pretended to be serving God, in reality they were trying to trap the Son of God.

Sabbath

The Law banned work of any kind, plowing , harvesting, collecting food and people generally did not leave their homes. It was observed as a day of joy and meditation as well as a time of rest for the family, servants and animals.

In (Acts 1:12) a Sabbath Day’s journey was about 1,000 yards from the center on one’s town.

ST. ANTONY GIANELLI

Bishop of Bobbio

Founder of Sisters of Mary dell'Orto

Antony Mary Gianelli was born to poor hardworking parents near Genoa, Italy. He showed an aptitude for learning, young Antony spent his days studying at school rather than helping his father and brothers on the farm.

Antony wanted to attend the seminary when he finished school but his family could not afford it. Fortunately, the owner of the farm decided to pay Antony's way. Because of his age, Antony was given special dispensation to be ordained in 1812.

As a priest, Antony became known for his eloquent preaching and his pastoral work. After more than two decades of dedicated service, Antony was named Bishop of Bobbio. He was a wise and caring bishop who did all he could to reach out to his parishioners.

Already in poor health, Antony died at the age of fifty-seven after suffering from overexposure to the sun while preaching before an image of Our Lady. Antony was canonized in 1951 by Pope Pius II. To this day, the Sisters of Mary dell'Orto a mission which he founded continues with his work in the United States and Asia.

ST. MICHAEL OF THE SAINTS

Michael was a Trinitarian friar and his brief life of thirty-three years was for his love of the Blessed Sacrament and Our Lord. Michael was generous to the poor and cared for the sick.

He was canonized on June 8, 1862 by Pope Pius IX. Michael is the cancer saint. Through his intercession and prayers may we all cry out, "A cure at last." (The Trinitarians)

ST. BARNABAS

Patron of Cyprus

"Joseph" left his native land of Cyprus and became a Christian. When he joined the Apostles he changed his name to Barnabas (which means son of encouragement.)

Barnabas was a man of deep faith and filled with the holy Spirit. He was the one who reached out to Paul, defended him and introduced him to the Apostles. For a short time, both Barnabas and Paul were leaders in the church of Antioch. Eventually the two separated and journeyed to different towns to spread Christianity.

Christian legend tells that Barnabas was stoned to death and that a handwritten copy of Saint Matthew's Gospel was found clasped to his heart.

ST. EPHREM OF SYRIA

Ephrem, as a young man was ordained a Deacon and became a well known teacher. The bishop suggested that Ephrem become a priest but was ordained a monk.

When the Persian army conquered his homeland, Ephrem escaped to the mountains and lived alone in a cave. People came to him to hear him preach and ask for help with their problems. Ephrem's homilies and hymns were devoted to Mary the Mother of God. He was called, "The Harp of the Holy Spirit."

Twelve promises to persons having devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which were communicated by Christ to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in a private relation in the year 1678.

1. I will give them all the graces necessary to their state in life.
2. I will establish peace in their home.
3. I will comfort them in all their afflictions.
4. I will be their secure refuge during life and above all in death.
5. I will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.
6. Sinners shall find in My Heart the source and the infinite ocean of mercy.
7. By devotion to My Heart tepid souls shall grow fervent.
8. Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
9. I will bless every place where a picture of My Heart shall be set up and honored.
10. I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
11. Those who promote this devotion shall have their names written in My Heart, never to be blotted out.
12. I will grant the grace of final penitence to those who communicate (receive Holy Communion) on the first Friday of nine consecutive months.

Keep me from sin and strengthen my will by helping me to keep watch over my senses, my imagination and my hear. Help us to correct our faults. Amen
