The Life of Jesus

Matthew 12 :38-45; Luke 11: 24-32

SIGNS FOR THE PHARISEES

Continuing His denunciation of those hypocritical leaders of the Jews, Jesus told them a parable illustrating what would befall this evil generation which had rejected His grace:

“When the unclean spirit has gone out of man, he roams through dry places in search of a resting place and finds none. Then he says, ‘I will return to my house which I left.’ When he arrived he finds his home unoccupied, swept and adorned.

Then he goes and takes with him seven other spirits more evil than himself and they enter his home and dwell there. The last state of that man becomes worse than the first. So shall it be with this evil generation also.”

It happened that as He was speaking a woman in the crowd cried out, “Blessed is the womb that bore Thee and the breasts that nursed Thee.” A mother herself, perhaps she was thinking of how proud the mother of such a wise and courageous son must be. Yet, though a mother may be justly proud of her son’s achievements, far more important than pride is fidelity to God. Amending the woman’s remark, Jesus said:

“Rather, blessed are they who hear the work of God and keep it.”

Some of the Scribes and Pharisees in the gathering now spoke up and said, “Master, we would see a sign from Thee.” Jesus replied:

“An evil and adulterous generation demands a sign and no sign shall be given it but the sign of Jonas, the prophet. For even as Jonas was in the belly of the fish three days and three nights in the heat of the earth.

The Queen of the South will rise up in the judgment with this generation and will condemn it; for she came from the ends of the earth to hear the wisdom of Solomon and behold a greater than Solomon is here.

The men of Nineve will rise up in the judgment with this generation and will condemn it, for they repented at the preaching of Jonas, and behold a greater than Jonas is here.”

Summary

The words of the woman in the crowd are an introduction to the devotion of the Church in subsequent ages to the Mother of Christ.

In her words and those of Christ, we see the double basis of that devotion. On these two words, her maternal dignity and her incomparable holiness has been based on the Church’s veneration of Mary through the ages.

ST. EMILY DE VIALAR

Anne Marguerite Adelaide Emily deVialar was the eldest child and only daughter of Baron James deVialar and his wife Antoinette. Her mother Antoinette was the daughter of Baron dePortal a physician to Louis XVIII and Charles X of France.

At the age of fifteen she was removed from school in Paris to become her father's companion who was now a widower. Upon the death of her grandfather Baron dePortal she was left with a considerable fortune which enabled her to leave her father's home.

Mother Emily founded the Congregation of Sisters of St. Joseph of the Apparition. They encountered the usual initial opposition and criticism. In 1835 she along with seventeen other Sisters received formal approval of the congregation. Their goal was to help the needy especially the sick and to educate children. The Sisters of St. Joseph were the first Catholic Nuns in modern times to be established in Jerusalem.

In the course of twenty-two years, Mother Emily saw her congregation grow from one to forty houses in Africa, Asia and Australia. She was a woman of exceptional strength, and endured many trials with firmness and dignity. She was canonized in 1951.

ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA

Patron of Portugal, Italy, Lost Articles, Travelers, Childless Women, Horses and Shipwrecks. Doctor of the Church

"Ferdinand" was born in Lisbon. His parents were young members of Portuguese nobility and confided his early education to the clergy in Lisbon.

Upon seeing the bodies of the Franciscans who had been martyred in Africa were brought home for burial and listening to other Franciscan stories, Ferdinand entered the Order of Augustinians and took the name of Anthony. Within a very short time he was permitted to embark for Morocco with the strong intention of preaching the Gospel to the Moors.

Anthony hardly had arrived when he suffered a severe illness which incapacitated him for many months. The African climate was not beneficial to him so he finally set sail for home in Portugal. However, the ship he was sailing on was caught in a storm and landed in Sicily. After several months, Anthony made his way to join the other Franciscans in Assisi. He was coldly accepted by the others and maintained a quiet lifestyle of prayer.

Anthony was asked to fill in for a priest who was ill. When people heard him speak they came from lands afar just to hear this brilliant, short, stout man speak. He became a teacher of the Franciscans then a preacher spreading his word in Italy, France and even Belgium. He converted many heretics through his works of mercy. But Anthony's fast work pace and poor health led him to his death at the age of thirty-six years.

St. Anthony preached for a year and a half in a town of Italy, called Padua. He preached, died there and his relics are venerated there. Anthony was canonized a year after his death and in 1946 was declared a Doctor of the Church.
