## The Life of Jesus

Matthew 18: 11-35

### PARABLE OF MERCY

Now Peter came to Jesus and asked, "Lord how often shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? Up to seven times?" But Jesus replied:

*"I do not say to thee seven times, but seventy times seven."*

Jesus related the parable of the Unmerciful Servant, illustrating the need of forgiving our fellowman.

*"This is why the kingdom of heaven is likened to a king who desired to settle accounts with his servants. When he had begun the settlement, one was brought to him who owed him ten thousand talents. As he had no means of paying, his master ordered him to be sold, with his wife and children and all that he had and payment to be made.*

*But, the servant fell down and besought him saying, 'Have patience with me and I will pay thee all!' Moved with compassion, the master of the servant released him and forgave him the debt.*

*As the servant went out, he met one of his fellow-servant who owed him a hundred denarii. He laid hold of him and throttled him, saying; 'Pay what thou owned.' His fellow-servant therefore fell down and began to entreat him, saying, 'Have patience with me and I will pay thee all.'" However, He would not; but went away and cast him into prison until he should pay what was due.*

*'His fellow servants therefore, seeing what had happened, were very much saddened, and they went and informed their master of what had taken place. Then his master called him and said to him; 'Wicked servant! I forgave thee all the debt, because thou didst entreat me. Shoudest not thou also have had pity on thy fellow-servant, even as I had pity on thee?*

*His master being angry, handed him over to the torturers until he should pay all that was due to him. So also My heavenly Father will do to you, if you do not each forgive your brothers from your hearts."*

#### Summary:

Peter thought he was being generous in suggesting "seven" as the number of times he should forgive offenses against him, for "seven" was commonly used to indicate a considerable number. However, Christ's answer "Seventy times seven," represents an infinitely greater number.

We must always forgive, for the true follower of Christ the measure of forgiveness is inexhaustible.

### BIRTH OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST

Tradition places John's home in a village six miles west of Jerusalem. A Franciscan Church marks the area called "St. John in the Mountains."

John was the son of Zechariah and Elizabeth a cousin of the Blessed Mother Mary. The birthday of St. John is observed on June 24th and is one of the oldest feast in the liturgy of the Church.

Thirty years after the birth of Jesus, John began his mission on the banks of the Jordan River. He was the last of the prophets of the Old Covenant. His work was to prepare the way for the coming of the long expected Messiah..

### ST. ALOYSIUS GONZAGA

*Patron of Young People*

Aloysius came from an illustrious family in Italy and lived in a castle. At the age of 21 years he signed away his rights to the lands of the Gonzaga family and became a Jesuit novice.

During an epidemic in Rome, he helped in the local hospital and before long he became ill as the disease engulfed his body. He died at the age of 23 years and never reached priesthood. He was canonized by Pope Benedict XIII in the year 1726.

### ST. JOHN FISHER

John was educated in England's finest schools and later ordained a priest. The royal family looked upon him as a holy and learned man. Ultimately, John became a bishop of Rochester and Chancellor of Cambridge University. His duties led him to the welfare of the poor and neglected.

During his time as a priest, he wrote eight books against heresy and King Henry VIII was proud to be his friend. When the Pope refused his request for a divorce and to acknowledge him as head of the Catholic Church the King went to John. But, John refused to sign the decree as the other bishops throughout England did. John was arrested for treason and put into prison without a trial and fourteen months later, John Fisher was beheaded.

### ST. THOMAS MOORE

*Patron of Lawyers*

Thomas went to school in London and served as a page for the Archbishop of Canterbury. Later he studied law and became a lawyer. He was a happily married man with four children. When his wife died, he married again for the sake of the children.

King Henry VIII made Thomas Chancellor of England. He enforced the laws and protected the poor against injustice. When King Henry asked Thomas to approve the divorce to marry a young girl named Ann Boleyn, Thomas refused to honor his request. The outraged King then originated a document making him head of the Catholic Church. Thomas ultimately refused to sign the document and was sent to prison in the Tower of London.

After much cold, hunger and solitude, Thomas More was led out to his death where he was beheaded for treason.
