Saint Olaf

Patron of Norway

Olaf was in his teens when he left his home in Norway to join a fierce band of Viking pirates. He fought battles in England and the Baltics, but while in Normandy became attracted to Christianity and was baptized.

After eight years of piracy, Olaf returned to Norway to inherit his father's land and succeeded him as lord. He quickly drove out the Swedes and Danes, seized the other lord's power and became King of Norway. Despite his violent past, Olaf brought peace and security to Norway. He abolished the old faith and customs, requiring the new laws to be executed justly and destroyed pagan temples.

Olaf sought missionaries from England to Christianize his people. Despite his good intentions, Olaf frequently resorted to force in his campaign to destroy paganism. His actions resulted in widespread discontent especially among those lords who did not approve of his changes. They finally drove Olaf from Norway, but two years later he fought valiantly to regain his kingdom but died a martyr, at the age of forty.

Olaf's fame spread to England where more than 40 ancient churches are dedicated to his name.

ST. BORIS AND ST. GLEB

Patrons of Russia

Boris and Gleb were brothers who were not missionaries, monks or teachers. Nonetheless they were among Russia's most famous saints. They were innocent men who faced an unjust death bravely and without opposition.

Boris and Gleb were sons of Anne of Constantinople and Vladimir of Kiev, who made Christianity the official religion of Russia. When Vladimir died in battle, his eldest son and half brother of Boris & Gleb, Svyatopolk took advantage of the confusion and seized control of his kingdom. Determined not to share the authority of the throne he set about plotting the murders of his siblings.

Boris, who was away from the capital when his father died, learned of his brother's plot as he was heading home to Kiev. His soldiers swore to defend the young man against Svyatopolk's men. However, Boris just twenty years was murdered just nine days after his father's death.

Gleb stayed away from Kiev for several months until he was invited to return by his half-brother Svyatopolk. On his return home, Gleb was ambushed and murdered like his sibling Boris. He too refused to take arms against Svyatopolk.

Four years later, Vladimir's son from a previous marriage, overthrew Svyatopolk and took control of the Kiev. He had the bodies of Boris and Gleb moved to St. Basil's Church and proclaimed the two men martyrs.

Boris and Gleb held firmly to the teaching of Jesus, to meet hatred with love, and violence with peace.

Father, help us all in the way of Peace.
