The Life of Jesus

Matthew 17: 14-21; Mark 9:13-31; Luke 9:17-45

JESUS CURES A POSSESSED BOY

At the foot of the mountains they found the other disciples in the midst of a crowd, arguing with some Scribes. The people were surprised, but ran to welcome Him, and Jesus said:

"What are you arguing about among yourselves?"

A man in the crowd answered that his son was possessed by an evil spirit which threw him into dangerous convulsions. He said that he had brought the boy to be cured by His disciples, but that they could not cure him. Jesus replied:

"O unbelieving generation, how long shall I be with you? How long shall I put up with you? Bring the boy to Me."

When the boy was brought before Jesus, the evil spirit convulsed his body and he fell to the ground, foaming at the mouth Jesus asked his father:

"How long is it since this has come upon him?"

"From his infancy, " the father answered. He begged Jesus to help if He could, but Jesus said:

"If thou canst believe, that all things are possible to him who believes."

"I do believe," cried the father. "Help my unbelief." Seeing that a crowd was forming again and Jesus said:

"Thou evil spirit, I command thee, go out of this boy and enter him no more."

Jesus helped the boy to his feet and returned him to his father. Later the disciples asked Him why they had been unable to cure the boy. Jesus answered:

"Because of your little faith; amen I say to thee, if you have faith like a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Remove from here', and it will remove. Nothing will be impossible to thee, but this kind can only be cast out by prayer and fasting."

Jesus said to His disciples:

"Store up these words in your minds, the Son of Man is to be betrayed into the hands of men, and they will kill Him, and having been killed, He will rise again on the third day."

Summary:

Prayer unites us to God; fasting or selfdenial frees us from the letters and power of uncontrolled passions.

ST. PETER CLAVER

Patron of African and Black Missions

Peter was a quiet and timid man but entered the Jesuit Order at the age of twenty-one. He left Spain to serve as a missionary in Cartagena (modern day Columbia).

Cartagena was a major port for the slave trade. Peter was shocked by the misery he found, terrified African slaves arriving in ships tightly packed with human cargo and rampant with disease and death. Peter was eager to spread God's word to the frightened slaves, but communication was difficult.

As each slave ship arrived, Peter brought lemons, brandy, food and medicine. Once he had tended to the sickest, and followed the rest of the slaves to plantations or mines. He used interpreters he had trained and with simple pictures to explain that God promised them a heavenly home. Peter also ministered in hospitals and prisons in the area.

Peter's efforts brought criticism from his superiors and townspeople alike. He persevered though and in the end, he had baptized over 300,000 Africans in less than 40 years. Peter survived the plague, but he remained an invalid until his death at the age of seventy-four.

ST. NICHOLAS OF TOLENTINO

Patron of Babies, Animals and Mariners

When Nicholas was born his parents felt he was an answer to their prayers. For years, they had been trying to have children. After they visited the shrine of St. Nicholas in Bari, Italy they begged the Lord for a son and soon after was blessed with a baby.

Nicholas initiated hermits, traveling frequently, to a nearby cave for solitude and spending hours there in prayer. He soon became an oblate with Augustinian friars and shortly thereafter made his profession and became a monk. While studying theology at the friary Nicholas distributed food to the needy, often giving away so much that the procurator of the monastery reported him to the prior for being too generous.

Ordained a few years later Nicholas soon became known for his miraculous healing ability. Nicholas wandered from monastery to monastery and one day while praying he heard a voice tell him to go to Tolentino. He was then sent there and remained for the rest of his life.

Nicholas was a compassionate man and began teaching God's love and mercy, finding the townspeople torn apart by a pope- versus emperor rivalry. Nicholas reached out to all people. He comforted the needy, counseled couples, prisoners and the dying (of which he had a special place in his heart.) He often interceded using his gift of healing, reminding those cured to "give thanks to God, not to me. I am only an earthen vessel, a poor sinner."

Today, the people who work in hospitals and at home, believe that caring for the dying is a "special privilege, a gift from God."

We pray for the everyone around the world who offer solace and compassion for our loved ones on Earth.
